Jesus' first miracle is full of fascinating details, layers and twists. When his mother tells him that the wedding wine has run out, Jesus' response comes across as something like 'so what?'. But Mary knows that Jesus will rise to the occasion and - miraculously - he produces something like 900 bottles of wine (equivalent) from water brought in jars meant for ritual washing. The cultural importance of wine for those people at that time was great and here is God in Jesus abundantly supplying it. Mary's instruction is to follow Jesus' instructions. That's when the miracle happens.
